

Vidya Ganga AI at Bharat Bodhan AI Conclave 2026

eVidyaloka was invited to be at the Bharat Bodhan AI Conclave 2026, which brought together educators, innovators, and policymakers to explore how Artificial Intelligence can strengthen the future of education in India.

At the event, team demonstrated how Vidya Ganga AI is designed to support rural classrooms by addressing key challenges such as limited access to quality content, high student-teacher ratios, and the need for real-time learning support. **Ravichandran V**, Chairperson of eVidyaloka, also addressed the conclave, sharing insights on the role of AI in enhancing access to quality education.



Built on a “Teacher-in-Loop” philosophy, Vidya Ganga AI is designed to assist teachers. The platform enables educators to transform lessons into interactive modules, generate assessments, deliver content in local languages, and gain insights into student learning. Through its participation in the conclave, eVidyaloka highlighted how AI can be used responsibly to empower teachers and enhance learning opportunities for students in rural India.

Launching the Mentoring Program for Young Innovators




NMIMS Interns contribute to eVidyalyoka's Mission

Joy of Connect with Diageo Employees

As part of International Women's Day celebrations, 36 employees from Diageo participated in the Joy of Connect initiative by eVidyaloka, conducting virtual sessions for students and Class Assistants between 17th and 27th February. The sessions featured inspiring stories of women, followed by an engaging activity where students reflected on and wrote about their future aspirations.



The enthusiastic participation and the heartfelt way students expressed their dreams made the experience truly memorable. In total, 36 student sessions and 10 Class Assistant sessions were conducted, reaching over 900 students across 8 states in 6 regional languages.

Strengthening Volunteer Partnerships



We continued its outreach efforts by conducting several introductory calls with prospective volunteering partners to expand opportunities for engagement. A new partnership was initiated with Scaler School of Technology, marked by the successful completion of the first volunteer orientation session on 13th February.



Discussions were also initiated with potential partners including Morgan Stanley, VYOM Foundation, Joy Thomas Foundation, and Volinity. In parallel, planning conversations for the upcoming academic year began to strengthen volunteer engagement and scale partnerships with existing collaborators such as JPMorgan Chase, HSBC, and KPMG.

Students actively participated in the process, helping evaluate their understanding of the concepts covered during the program and their overall learning outcomes.

The assessment has now been successfully completed across all participating schools. The process provided valuable insights into student progress and will help guide future learning support and program improvements.

eleVate Webinar: Power Up Your Virtual Classroom
