






Recognising Excellence: Volunteer Champion Awards Jury Round

EmpowerED Refresher Training for Class Assistants in Assam



On 2nd-3rd August, a two-day refresher training under the EmpowerED Programme was held at Don Bosco Institute, Guwahati, supported by the Murty Trust. The sessions brought together Class Assistants from across Assam to revisit eVidyaloka's mission, clarify roles, strengthen operational practices, and explore new initiatives like the EDGE and Spoken English programs.

















Through interactive activities, peer learning, and recognition of their contributions, the training renewed motivation and equipped Class Assistants with greater clarity, confidence, and skills to create meaningful classroom experiences for rural students.

Ghattu Block Rises from 427th to 5th in NITI Aayog Rankings (2024–25)

Ghattu Block created history in 2024-25, rising from 427th to 5th in the NITI Aayog Block Ranking. SSC results showed a remarkable 10.79% improvement, increasing from 84.06% in March 2024 to 94.86% in March 2025. This outstanding achievement reflects the power of strong leadership, teamwork, and community-driven education.

To address teacher shortages, eVidyaloka provided volunteer-led classes, practical lessons, interactive teaching methods, and 10th-grade worksheets, helping students strengthen understanding, build confidence, and prepare effectively for exams.

eleVate Webinar: Mindful Classrooms for Impactful Teaching

On August 23rd, we held the first eleVate webinar of 2025-26 with a session on Mindful Classrooms. The session was designed to help volunteers make their teaching more effective and impactful. Led by Veena Nair from the Shree Shivkrupanand Swami Foundation, the webinar highlighted how meditation can reduce stress, improve focus, and build harmony in classrooms. Volunteers also experienced an 8-minute guided meditation, offering them simple tools to reconnect with themselves. This marks the beginning of our monthly eleVate series-designed to





bring fresh learning opportunities that help volunteers create a greater impact.

BITS Pilani Goa: Driving Impact through Pro Bono Consulting
